Opening Remarks at 3pm John Henry, Executive Director of Flint Institute of Arts, Michigan

Mr. John Henry was the first curator to exhibit New New Painters^{*} in 1991, (even before their grand opening in Paris in 1992). He also organized the second large exhibition of NNP in 1999. In his Foreword to the catalog of the exhibition "**25 Years of NNP**" he wrote: *I feel it's only a matter of time before this group of masterful artists receives recognition at the highest level.*

In spite of many subsequent international exhibitions, the artistic innovations of NNP proved to be "ugly" or "too new" to be understood in their own time and artists had to go 'underground'. The renowned Canadian filmmaker, T. W. Peacocke is producing a documentary about this experience entitled 'Art, Freedom, and Cliché' and will be recording the historical opening of this exhibition.
